



IT Policy Rules for BlackBerry Internet Service Instant Messaging: Yahoo! Messenger

Overview

This document describes the IT policy rules that are available on the BlackBerry Enterprise Server™ that you can use to manage Yahoo!® Messenger on a BlackBerry® device.

IT policy rules for Yahoo! Messenger

You can manage the usage of Yahoo! Messenger by using the default IT policy rules on the BlackBerry Enterprise Server.

Yahoo! Messenger IT policy implementation scenarios

You set the Allow Public Yahoo! Messenger Services IT policy to FALSE before users download Yahoo! Messenger.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The service book that connects to the Yahoo! server is removed from the BlackBerry devices that are affected by the IT policy implementation.
You set the Allow Public Yahoo! Messenger Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The service book that connects to the Yahoo! server

IT policy to FALSE after users download Yahoo! Messenger.	is removed from the BlackBerry devices that are affected by the IT policy implementation. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The Yahoo! icon remains on the Home screen.• If users attempt to sign in, a message appears on their BlackBerry device that indicates that they are not permitted to use Yahoo! Messenger.

Note: The Yahoo! Messenger download icon is not affected by the implementation of the Allow Public Yahoo! Messenger Service IT policy rule.

Importing custom IT policy rules

Custom IT policy rules in the Service Exclusivity Policy group can be added to

- BlackBerry Enterprise Servers version 3.6 or later for Microsoft® Exchange

Custom IT policy rules in the Service Exclusivity Policy group cannot be added to

- BlackBerry Enterprise Servers for IBM® Lotus® Domino®
- BlackBerry Enterprise Servers for Novell® GroupWise®

You can add custom IT policy rules to the BlackBerry Enterprise Server by importing an IT policy template file that contains SQL commands. The policy templates can be downloaded from the BlackBerry Technical Knowledge Center. See the *BlackBerry Enterprise Server Administration Guide* for more information on importing the IT policy template file to the BlackBerry Enterprise Server.

Delete Yahoo! Messenger from a BlackBerry device

1. On the Home screen, click the **Options** icon.
2. Click **Applications**.
3. Click the Yahoo! Messenger program.
4. Click **Delete**.
